

### What is the YOYO?

The YOYO is a voluntary phone interview that students with disabilities take part in one year after exiting high school. You'll be asked questions about work, school, and life! Your answers are confidential, and your identity is never reported.

# Why is the YOYO important?

You'll have the opportunity to share your experiences. Tell us what you wish you were taught, what you are glad you learned, and how things are going since leaving high school. Your answers will help improve transition outcomes for future students.

## When is the YOYO?

You'll be contacted by phone to participate one year after exiting high school, between April and August. Please make sure your high school has your updated contact information before you leave at the end of your final year.

#### Fun Facts:



Over half of former students (61.5%) participated in the 2024 YOYO interview. These students exited high school during the 2022 – 2023 school year.



Only **37%** of former students pursuing post-secondary education contacted their Disability Services Coordinator (DSC).
